A NEW DEPARTURE.

Liberals in every direction are "kicking" against the attitude of the Globe on the tariff issue.

Not content with being the alleged organ of the liberal party, it assumes to be the dictator of that party.

It ignores Mr. Blake. It is doing its best to wreck his prospects.

Not that a dozen liberals can be found to endorse its course.

The liberal party has no need of such an organ as the Globe; still less of such a dictator as Gordon Brown.

As we announced yesterday, Mr. Blake will within a few days issue a manifesto to the country. It will state the position of the liberal party.

Till that is issued, liberals should avoid the nostrums of the Globe, connected as they are, to ruin their party and their leader.

The political funeral of the Globe is announced for next week, and those most interested will take good care that the corpse is ready.

DEPENDENCY AND THE RE-DISTRIBUTION BILL.

For three years previous to September, 1878, the question of a higher tariff for Canada had been discussed by the people.

It was repeated. The conservatives in 1878 determined there should not be another chance for a mistake, and so it was made the sole issue before the people that year.

Since then numerous by-elections have been held and the result has proven that instead of falling off the national policy has gained in the favor of the people.

This progress made by this measure is evidently going on still, and is perceived by the vast majority of the people, and no doubt it will be supported at the coming elections by a large majority.

This tariff is clearly consistent with liberal principles. The right to tax British goods was contended for by the old liberals for many years, and it was owing to the earnest that that right was obtained when the usual instructions to the governor-general to reserve every bill passed by the Canadian parliament relating to our tariff, was abrogated.

Moreover the recent resolutions of Mr. Blake relating to commercial independence and our right to make foreign treaties, are founded on the continuance of the national policy.

These resolutions were simply a corollary of it. There is no doubt that we can give foreign nations now more advantages than they can get from England by means of our tariff. It is also a fact that in a short time we shall be glutted with manufacturers, owing to our own limited market.

We must get an outlet somewhere. It is foolishness to think that England can or will be inclined to find us foreign markets for our goods, when she is straining every nerve to find markets for her own goods, and cannot succeed.

Mr. James Bethune is a possible reform candidate for Stormont, but nothing definite has been determined.

In South Leeds, George Taylor (conservative), and C. E. Britton (opposition), were put up yesterday.

Dr. Sullivan is to be entrusted with the conservative banner in Kingston.


