Returns From Booths Throughout Ontario Show Seven Conservative Gains and Eleven Losses-One Laborite Is Elected-Bilingual Issue Had Little or No Effect In French Counties-Majority Will Be 60.

Toronto, Dec. 12 .- Sir James Whit-Toronto, Dec. 12.—Sir James Whitney has gone back to power with a majority big enough for all "practical purposes," in fact, a lot of his friends believe it is still too large, but a great many of them did not have the heart to help reduce it.

The Prime Minister will have a majority of 60 whereas in the last House
