St. James Church

General Thanksgiving for the Blessing of Peace.

Although the notice of the appointment by Royal Proclamation of Sunday July 6th, as a day of general thanksgiving for the blessing of peace was comparatively short, a special service was held in St. James' Church at eight p. m. A form for this service had been issued some time since by the Archbishop of the Diocese and this was used, the psalms being the 46th and the 124th, the scripture lesson taken from the 15th chapter of Exodus, and the prayers including as well as specific thanksgiving for the blessing of peace, and a remembrance of those who laid down their lives in the great struggle, petition for the sick and wounded, and for deliverance from the dangers which threaten us from foes at home within and without. The rector's sermon was based on the 8th verse of the 85 psalm: "I will hear what the Lord God will speak; for He will speak peace unto his people and to His saints; but let them not turn again to folly." After pointing out how fitting it was that a day should be officially appointed and observed for a conscious acknowledgment of God's goodness in again giving the blessing of peace, the speaker went on to say it was also fitting that on such occasions we should endeavor to get beyond and beneath what might easily resolve itself into mere sentiment. That at any rate was the suggestion of the text. Looking back and endeavoring to interpret that which has now passed into history, the way we were drawn into the war was not without significance and in accepting the call to the service of others we were true, not only to the best traditions of our race, but also to those instincts which, though seemingly becoming dormant, thank God were not dead. "I believe," he said, "That it is God, and God only, Who has raised up Great Britain to be what she is, even as I also believe He has thus raised her up for great and holy purposes. Wherever her flag has gone it has been her aim to lift the poor out of the dust, the beggar from the dunghill, and if he has sufficient capacity, to set him among the princes. Had the British Empire, then, been rent in twain by dissection, of which there was a grave danger when the crisis came, or now by a victorious Germany, there would have come an end of her beneficent work throughout the world, and the march of Christian civilization would have been retarded by centuries. But, and this is our point here and now, it is quite possible to carry out the purposes of God without knowing Him whose purposes they are. We may be servants without being sons. We may do the right thing from the wrong motive. We may make sacrifices for righteousness without being righteous. Hence there comes a call to look within, for if we get no further than this, just as surely as that night follows day there will come a nemesis. We can escape ultimate loss only by keeping in line with the declared will of God and seeking His ends in His own way. As has been said—God has one message for the ages. The "orders for the day" which have never been cancelled come to us still in God's testimony to the Lord Jesus Christ, "This is my beloved Son, hear Him." Other voices may seek to entice, but if we are to make righteousness prevail in the earth, then he who is the righteousness of God must be ours. Reconstruction is the watchword today in every department of our life, and if we are wise we shall endeavour to realize our dependence on God whose balance trieth the nations, to lift up and to cast down; for our future will surely be decided by our faithfulness (or otherwise) to His eternal laws. To this end, then, "Follow the Christ, the King; Live pure, speak true, right wrong, follow the King—Else, wherefore born?" In concluding an appeal was also made on behalf of all those who had "crossed the great divide" in the the war. "A better Canada as well as a better world should be our motto. Better, that is, not merely from a material standpoint, but in all those things which truly exalt a nation." Besides suitable hymns heartily sung by the congregation, the choir sang during the offertory a specially written anthem entitled "O Welcome Peace," the solos being taken by Mrs. H. Ruggles and Mr. Thos. Handley. Altogether the service was one which will long be remembered by those present.

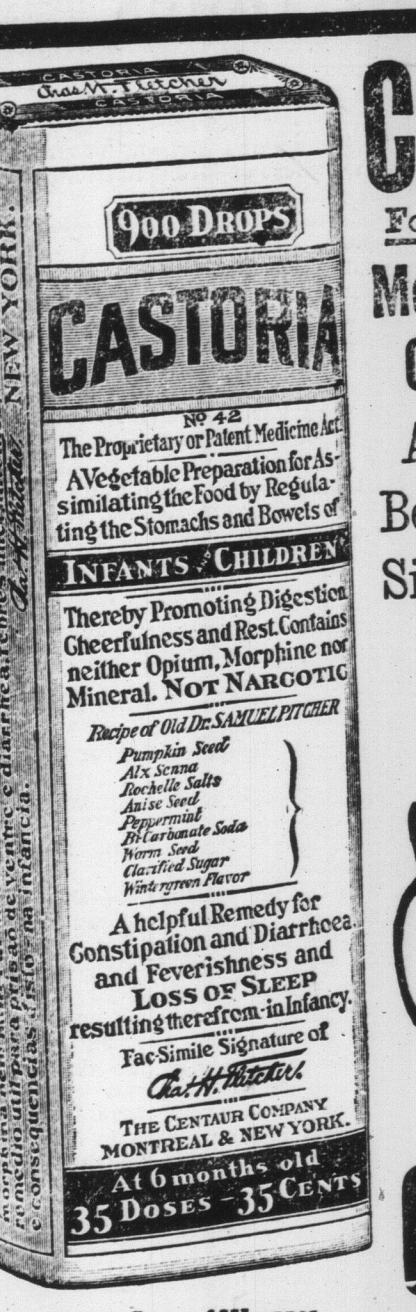
