## OUR NORTH-WEST TROUBLES

The troubles in the North-West, especially in and around the course of tho great Saskatchewan river, developed very suddenly into. a very serious rebellion against the governing bodies of the country and took the great bulk of thi C inadian people by surprise.

The extent of the revolt, although not very large at first, caused considerable aneasiness to the authorities at Ottawa, on account of the uncertainty as to the action of the Indian tribes, and the vast amount of country to bs preserved from attack and preserved in peace ahould a general rising take place.

Great credit is undonbtedly due to the Government at Ottawa for d'spatching quickly large bodies of welleyuipped volunteers to the scene of action, which in a great measure prevented a general rising of many Indian tribee and aaved our North-West from a great conflagration.
While going to press there is every indication that quietness and apeody settlement will be obtained, but it ie more than likely that some troops will require to be stationed there for a fow months before permanent peroo is establishod and settlements made with the rebels and different Indian tribes.
Wo regret that a cortain class in the country ahould have been so imprudent as to publioly demonstrate their sympathy with the rebels at a time when every effort ahould have been directed towards restoring peuce and order, eeppecially as it is pretty generally admitted and known that the grievances must be investigated without delay and just ones immediately set right.
There will, however, be ample time and opportunity after peace has been reetored to champion the cauce of the North.West half-hreeds and Indians in a legal and conortitutional spirit.

No doubt the Government Fill be bitterly atteoked
and blamed for the causes which led to the rebollion, and will find it difficult onough to cloar thair atirter ; still the country will upnold them in giving ataple justice to those who have remained loyal and peecoable in the midst of the tarmoil, notwithetanding thoic. grievances, while to thoee who have planged the country into serious expenee for was preparations, panishment, in some form or other, should be firet dealt, especially to the ring leaders and heads of the rebollion.

We sincerely hope, however, that the rebels will rogret the steps they have taken, and will penitantly promiee to never again disturb the peace of a country, in which they, as well as all of us, hope and bolieve has a great future, if not imporilled by lawleses nota.

The loseses are no doubt the most eerious iteme of expenditure and not until a more vigorous and dotermined effort is made outride of their branch and head office by good practioal and experionced experts to axamine into the condition and value, etc. of risk, will there be anything like pormanent and sound improvement.
