PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.

Forty-Year Annuities.

The undersigned will receive tenders for the purchase of terminable annuities running for a period of forty years. Issued by the Province of Ontario under authority of an Act of the Provincial Parliament (47 Vic., Cap. 31.)

The annuities will be in the form of certificates, signed by the Provincial Treasurer, guaranteeing half-yearly payments at the office of the Provincial Treasurer, in Toronto, of sums of \$100, or larger sums, on the 30th day of June and 31st day of December in each year for forty years from 30th day of June next, the first half-yearly certificate being payable on the 31st December next.

The total amount of annuities to be issued in 1891, and for which tenders are asked, is \$14,000 annually, but tenders will be received for any part of the same not less than \$200 annually.

Tenders will be required to state the capital sum which will be paid for either the whole annuities offered, or such portion as may be tendered for.

Tenders will be received up to the 10th day of July next. Notification of allotments will be given to tenders on or before July 15th, and payments from accepted tenders will be required to be made within ten days thereafter.

Tenders for the whole amount offered, if preferred, may be, upon condition that the annuities may be payable in Great Britain, in sterling.

The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted unless otherwise satisfactory.

NOTE.—Illustration of calculation on interest basis: At the rate of 4 per cent. per annum (or in tredecim, 2 per cent. half-yearly), a present payment of \$1,987.25 would represent an annuity of \$100 for forty years, payable half-yearly, while the actual yearly payment for the forty years would be a fraction above 5 per cent. on the principal sum.
