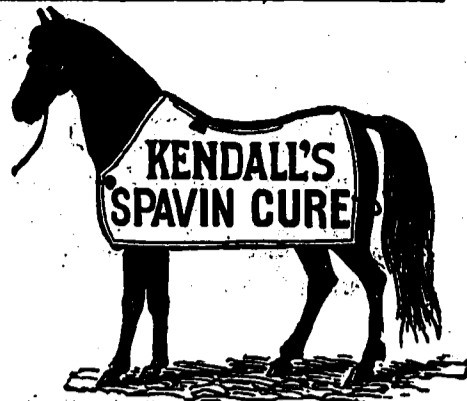


MAIL CONTRACT.
