

Questions

5. The Great Slave Lake railway informs that it has provided a training on the job program for Indians and Eskimos who require further training to meet the needs of their specific positions; the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development has provided specific assistance by selecting workers through its placement service and by advising on the problems of relocated employees. Training within industry is part of this department's policy because it meets the specific needs of the employer and the employee. In general, these workers have received training in heavy equipment maintenance and operation or general construction prior to this employment, but this may be considered

specific training only in terms of broad general coverage in an occupational area. Trainees were placed on wages as soon as they started employment and full costs of specific training were paid by the railway.
