the answers are back, but I think the gist of the report has already been made public. I held meetings with the trucking association in the Atlantic provinces last week and they made some proposals to us relating to the recommendations in this report and they are being examined. I will look into the matter still further and if there is any impediment to releasing the report I will be glad to look into that so that my hon. friend can have it.

Mr. Thomas (Moncton): Is the committee still meeting and, if so, has the minister been in consultation with reference to further recommendations coming from them?

Mr. Jamieson: The committee is still meeting with regard to the proposals they have already advanced to us. They are discussing those with us. It is my intention to invite the provinces and incidentally, to add the province of Quebec, to maintain this as an ongoing committee. I hope they will accept.

MONTREAL-MEASURES TO PROVIDE EMPLOY-MENT FOR DISPLACED CANADAIR WORKERS -NOTICE OF MASS LAY-OFFS
