Dear Sir, -

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the Sth.inst.

I regret that it is impossible to inform you where Junior Trade Commissioners will serve, as that will entirely depend upon the exigencies of the Service, when they have completed their instructional and probationary period in this country.

The initial salary of Junior Trade Commissioners is \$1,260 per annum (if without business experience) which will be increased upon recommendation for efficient service at the rate of \$120 per annum, until a maximum of \$1,500 has been reached. A salary of \$1,800 per annum will be paid to successful candidates with business experience of at least three years. The salary in each case will be supplemented by whatever bonus may be provided by law. As soon as received from the Civil Service Commission, I shall send you a printed sheet giving a little more information in regard to conditions. As you are no doubt aware, all things being more or less equal, returned soldiers are likely to receive a preference.
