WILL BE DEALT WITH AS UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Expropriation Held to Be Still Before City Council For Disposal by Formal Vote.

Expropriation of C.P.R. property at the corner of King and Yonge streets was not passed on by the board of control yesterday.

"Why didn't it come up?" said acting-Mayor Spence. "Well, why should it? The board of control has already passed it on to the city council and the aldermen have neither rejected the proposition nor referred it back."

At last meeting of the city council the question was taken up in committee, of the whole and passed on to council by a majority of two. Then a motion was brought forward that this clause be struck out but it was voted down. Finally a motion that all the report of the board of control except this cause be adopted was passed and so the matter stands at present.

"It will come up at Friday's meeting under the head of unfinished business," said Controller Spence.

The contention of the acting Mayor was called to attention that General Manager McNeill had declared that the C.P.R. is unalterably opposed to any interference with its plans for building at the corner of Yonge and King-streets. Controller Spence, who is still convinced that the proper course for the city council to take is to expropriate the property and take five feet off the west and north sides to widen Yonge and King-streets.

"Of course, I will expect Mr. McNeill to object to anybody interfering with the plans of his company," said the acting Mayor. "Still I feel sure the C.P.R. will be glad to buy back the site, especially as they will have a chance to increase their floor space by the addition of the bank property to the east. While Mr. McNeill made no positive statement on the matter in his interview yesterday, I certainly did not infer from his attitude that the C.P.R. will refuse to buy back the property and move their building elsewhere, in case of expropriation."

"Some of the opposition are sure that the proposition will get it quietus from council on Friday, but on the other hand several aldermen are disposed to look favorably on the scheme now that there is every probability of the C.P.R. sticking to the site."

"It is a different aspect on the matter and makes it look good," said one erstwhile obstructionist.

WILL ERECT SKYSCRAPER
Ten-Storey Building for East Adelaide-street.

The properties from 42 to 52 on the north-east side of Adelaide-street have been sold to Hon. J. H. Phippen, K.C., and Noel Marshall. The price mentioned is \$1,000 per foot, making a total of \$80,000, the property having a frontage of 80 feet.

The property is situated immediately east of the post office, extending easterly to a lane which runs from Adelaide to Lombard-street.

A handsome modern office building ten stories high, will be erected on the site, the area of which is somewhat greater than that of the Lumsden building.

The assessment on Nos. 42 to 52 is set at \$19,275.

STREET CARS KILLED TWELVE.
According to returns issued by the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board, 12 persons were killed and 720 injured by street cars in Toronto in 1910. The report says that 152 persons were injured from "causes beyond their own control." The others "from their own carelessness. The deaths on all the electric roads numbered 24.
