

## R. SMITH'S DEATH REGRETTED BY ALL MASONS

Aubrey White, Who Was Re-Elected Grand Master by Acclamation, Made a Reference to Motor Car Accident in His Closing Address—Officers Elected.

With the installation of officers in Convention Hall yesterday afternoon, the 57th annual conference of the Masonic Grand Lodge of Canada, A. F. & A. M., was terminated.

Before closing, W. Bro. Aubrey White, who was re-elected by acclamation, made a fitting reference to the death of Bro. R. W. Smith, who was killed in the automobile accident near Richmond Hill, on Wednesday night. Mr. White pointed out the uncertainty of life and advised all the members to be prepared for the end.

When the master was re-elected, a bouquet was presented to him by W. Bro. E. A. Chandler of Washington Lodge, Buffalo, on behalf of the members of that lodge.

The credential committee showed a registration of 1559 votes by 382 members. There are 419 lodges on the roll, 28 represented by officers and 72 by proxy. Ninety lodges were not represented.

In Ottawa Next.

It was decided to hold the next meeting in Ottawa in 1913.

## NO CLUE YET TO MISSING \$8000

Deputy Finance Minister Boville in Dark—Enquiry Into Farmers' Bank Indefinitely Adjourned.

OTTAWA, July 18.—(Special).—Before the royal commission investigating the affairs of the Farmers' Bank this afternoon, Deputy Finance Minister Boville testified emphatically that he got none of the proceeds of the mysterious cheque for \$8000 used to facilitate the obtaining of the bank charter, and knew nothing of it.

The books of the new Russell Hotel were produced and Peter Ryan was shown to have registered there on Nov. 28, 1906. There was no room marked beside his name, and the hotel proprietor, George Mulligan, stated that if Ryan had a room it would be recorded.

W. H. Calvert, ex-M.P., did not know whether he introduced Travers to Ryan or not. The witness knew nothing about the cheque said to be sent to Ryan by Travers in an envelope.

Jack O'Brien, clerk at the hotel at the time of Ryan's visit, testified that he did not remember seeing any letter to Peter Ryan or of him enquiring for one. According to his evidence Ryan did not have a room.

The hearing was adjourned indefinitely, and unless something new develops it will not be reopened until the fall.

With Louis Disbrow, world's racing monarch, Joe Nikrent, Pacific Coast champion, and with B. H. Endicott, famed Indianapolis driver, in Toronto, the city becomes the centre of attraction for the first time in its history, in the speed world to-day.

The trial of the race car accident, where they scored a complete victory in every event in which they were eligible in the big three-day meet of the Automobile Club of Montreal.

Contrary to custom, on half-mile tracks where one star generally makes several laps, there will be no less than four celebrated pilots at the wheel of cars that have no equals for speed in the motor world on Saturday's meet in Exhibition Park.

Disbrow brought his big 20 H. P. straight-away racer, which will be used Saturday afternoon in the time trials and other events. The monarch of the dirt track is in existence and was transported from Montreal in its private railway garage.

A Match Race.

The 20 H. P. Fiat was built in Turin, Italy, and shipped to America shortly after the arrival of the Blitzen Benz into the United States. The plan was to have it issue a challenge which the German Benz would have to accept or stand to lose its reputation. The match race was framed up but it never took place.

Since buying the car Disbrow has lowered several world's records. He knocked over ten seconds off Barney Oldfield's mark for a mile on a two-mile dirt raceway and timed the second of the world's record for half-mile tracks.

At San Francisco Disbrow again lowered several marks and put the Fiat mark on a half-mile speedway so low that it probably will never be bested.

Won Many Races.

No driver ever lived who stood up under all kinds of difficulties like Louis Disbrow and while he won more races than any other driver in the world, he was not without his share of accidents. In his wonderful little machine, broke four world's records. It was while driving this car in California that Disbrow acquired the world's 15, 20 and 25-mile marks and beat every driver that faced him.

Disbrow, after getting a look at the Exhibition track yesterday, said: "Looks faster than any half-mile course I have ever seen and with an even break in luck I will get a big pot."
