With only moderate receipts of about 70 cars altogether, with 897 cattle, 423 calves, 1668 hogs and 23 sheep and lambs, and following on after a day of complete inaction yesterday trading on the cattle market was good and steady with Monday's best prices, tho the strength of the market was not particularly reflected in the prices.
