San Francisco, April 12.—The big British ship Adair came into port late last night, battered by storms and with much of her woodwork burned away.

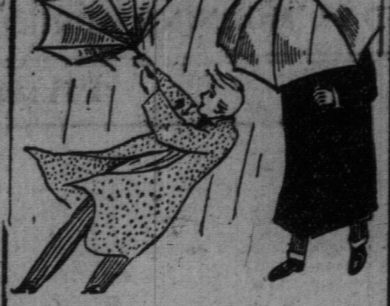
