LANDSLIDE FOR DONOVAN SWEEPS CITY, VILLAGE AND TOWNSHIP BROCKVILLE GOES TORY

Adverse Vote of 169 Turned Into Probable Majority of 250—Liberals Dismounted—Big Celebration When Result Became Known.

FIRST TIME IN THIRTY YEARS RIDING IS CONSERVATIVE

BROCKVILLE, Oct. 7.—(Special).—W. A. Lewis, Liberal candidate for the legislature, was fairly snowed under today by A. E. Donovan, Conservative. Many of the polls being held in outlying parts, full returns were not made to-night, but the majority will be at least 250. Donovan won in the town by 165 majority and swept nearly every township and village.

OUTRAGES AT ODESSA JEWS AGAIN IN TERROR

Mourners in Cemetery Were Stoned and Fired Upon—Cossacks Laughed as People Ran.

ODESSA, Oct. 7.—The unionists of Odessa continued their attacks and outrages upon Jews to-day. They began by surrounding the Hebrew cemetery, where a funeral service was going on. First they stoned and then fired revolver shots at the mourning Jews, many of whom were wounded.

CAUGHT SEVENTEEN CHINESE Were Being Smuggled Into Canada From Newfoundland

OTTAWA, Oct. 7.—(Special).—The department of trade and commerce has been informed that 17 Chinese, who were caught while being smuggled into Canada from Newfoundland, have been sentenced to nine months in jail at Sydney.

IGNORE WARNING TWO DROWN IN LAKE

Father and Son Upset From Canoe Off Sunnyside—Relatives See Them Drown.

Two more victims were claimed by the waters of Humber Bay in yesterday afternoon's storm, but that William B. Rose, 48 years, and John Rose, 18 years, his son, both of 681 West Queen-street, are dead, is due to their own recklessness.

Despite the protests of C. Mitchell, boat-house-keeper at the Humber, they set out to paddle a flimsy canvas canoe across the bay to Dean's boat-house at Sunnyside, where they had hired it in the morning.
