The encouraging cables from Liverpool, and an advance in the cash article of 1½c per bushel at Minneapolis, and ½c at Duruth, together with large sales of flour in the Northwest, caused a stiff feeding in the Onicago market this month's delivery rose ½c and the remote options advanced 1½c. Large primary receipts and a falling off in export bids brought about a reaction. Prices firmed up again on large cash sales, and closed ½c to ½c above yesterday's final figures.
