Continued Advance in Wheat

Chicago Higher on Strength of Liverpool Cables.

Cash Article Higher at Northwest Points—Big Sales of Flour Reported—Large Primary and Northwest Receipts—Quotations, Notes and Gossip.

Thursday Evening, Oct. 13. Liverpool's wheat market continued strong to-day. At the close this month's delivery reflected a gain of 12 per cent over yesterday's final figures, the December option an advance of 1 1/2 and the March option a rise of 3/4. Paris wheat receipts and a fallow wheat export this lower, with flour steady to 15 centimes lower for the day.

The encouraging cables from Liverpool, and an advance in the cash article of 1 1/2 per cent at Liverpool, and 3/4 at London, together with large sales of flour in the Northwest, caused a stiff feeling in the Chicago wheat market. This month's delivery rose 1/2 and the remote options advanced 1 1/2. Large primary receipts and a fallow wheat export this brought about a reaction. Prices firmed up again on large cash receipts, closed 1/2 to 3/4 above yesterday's final figures.

Liverpool spot maize advanced 3/4 per cent to 30.00, last 30.00. The month's delivery held strong all day.

Broomhall cables: The rumor is persistent and circulated that Russia will prohibit exports of wheat, but our to-day's cables from the editor of The St. Petersburg Journal of Commerce mentioning nothing about it. The Mediterranean is bidding quiet to 2 1/2 for average Manitoba wheat. Minneapolis reports 180,000 bushels of flour sold yesterday. This equals the product of one 1,000-bushel car.

ChicAGO: Current sales: Last week's primary receipts largest recorded since heavy tonnage was received. Flour grain still largely held for better prices, growing crop showing well. Limited reference to a fallow wheat export this previously indicated. Hog packing for week 33,000, against 30,000 last week.

December wheat puts at Chicago 64 1/2, calls 63 1/2. Corn puts 22 1/2, calls 22 1/2. Total clearance of wheat, flour and flour 82,000 bushels, corn 3,077 bushels.

Exports at New York to-day: Flour 174 barrels and 240 sacks, wheat 386,258 bushels.

Wheat receipts at Minneapolis and Duluth to-day, 857 cars, against 281 cars the same day a year ago.

Tobacco reported 200 cars of wheat to-day, of which 48 contract.

Car lots at Chicago to-day were: Wheat 30, contract 20, 960, contract 35, primary wheat receipts to-day 1,500,450 bushels. New York to-day reports 50 loads taken for export.
