Ottawa, May 17.—Provincial claims came before the House this morning, and the question of jurisdiction over the three-mile limit developed.

It was a very intricate constitutional question as to whether the Dominion or Provincial authorities had jurisdiction over the three-mile area.

The Minister of Marine and Fisheries replied that Prince Edward Island makes the contention that the tax on commercial vessels is no heavier than impositions on local business of a similar kind.

The whole question being devoted to this question of Provincial claims. The Government challenged the Opposition's position.

"Other provinces will be filing claims for breach of Federal obligations under the Act of Confederation."
