Its delegation carried banners with the words "King for Lennox."

Mr. Lennox, in making his acknowledgment of the support of his friends, declared he would not find words to fittingly express his gratitude. He, however, would tell them that he felt prouder to be with them than he ever had. Although for the time being he was a defeated candidate, he believed that he was a great deal happier than the man who defeated him. (Cheers.) Mr. Lennox then spoke of the great kindness he had received from the friends of his friends, and hoped he would be able to show how much he appreciated it. It was true he had not yet redeemed the riding, but he would conquer it. (Cheers.) While he had such sturdy friends as those he saw before him, he was not at all discouraged.

Continuing, Mr. Lennox said he felt much more grateful to them by reason of the fact that they assisted him in his campaign voluntarily and without price. He denied any man to say that he was a crooked politician, and he was amazed that a crooked politician had been elected against him by Mr. Davis. (Cheers.)
