at Higher Prices.

ARGENTINE LINSEED CROP IN DANGER

Liverpool Cables Firm—General
Markets, Notes and

Liverpool wheat futures closed 3d higher to-day, and corn futures were unchanged. American grain markets were firmer to-day. At Chicago, September wheat advanced 1/2c from yesterday, September corn 1/4c, and September oats 1/4c.

Northwest cars to-day, 400; yesterday, 387; a year ago, 815.

Liverpool receipts of wheat during the past three days, 217,000 casks, including 195,000 American.

Friday's Argentine wheat shipments, 139,000 bushels; maize, 1,335,200 bushels.

Beetroot says: Argentine advances are generally of a favorable tenor for wheat. Rain is badly needed, and, unless it comes soon, the linseed crop will be seriously injured.
