Mother's Helper and Visiting Housekeeper Tells Red Cross of Work Begun in Saint John

Wonderful work, splendidly done, was the comment regarding the usefulness of Mrs. Estey, the mother's helper and visiting housekeeper, who on Dec. 18 completed her first month in that enterprise. Mrs. Estey is employed by the Saint John Red Cross Society and submitted her first monthly report to the society's meeting in its new rooms, 23 King street yesterday afternoon.

It was unanimously decided to continue Mrs. Estey's services for the next three months as funds on hand were adequate. Mrs. L. F. Longley, president, was in the chair and the meeting discussed at some length the matter of cooperation with other organizations in its welfare work for soldiers' dependents and finally referred the whole matter to a meeting of the executive to be held next week.

Mrs. Estey had made in all 43 visits during the first month, staying from six to eight days in some homes and making shorter visits to others. She found everyone very appreciative and grateful but she pointed out that it was hard to change the habits of people in a few visits. However she reported that in all the homes she visited the people had been very agreeable and she thought they were trying to follow the advice given, with regard to better methods, more economical housekeeping, better cooking and more cleanly habits.

Whatever was needed to be done Mrs. Estey had done.

SOME CONDITIONS

She had found some very bad conditions in some of the homes, many of the houses were in such a state of disrepair that it was hard to get into them and one house had only one light room in it. In one home a 13 year old daughter recently recovered from a typhoid was trying to do all the work during her mother's illness. Mrs. Estey had tended the babies, tidied the houses, mended the clothes, cooked and sewed new articles of clothing. She told of the various problems in each household and how she had met them.

A very warm tribute of praise was paid to her and arrangements were made for having on hand certain supplies which Mrs. Estey had found to be lacking in the homes.

The report of the treasurer, R. F. Wright, was read and he reported that among the recent receipts had been \$10, the proceeds of the tea held in connection with the sale of soldiers' work. The balance on hand was \$1,706.65.

Burns a full list of donors and members obtained in the recent campaign had been drawn up and it was found that the sum of \$874 was to be given to the provincial Red Cross on the basis of \$1 for each donor of that amount or more.
