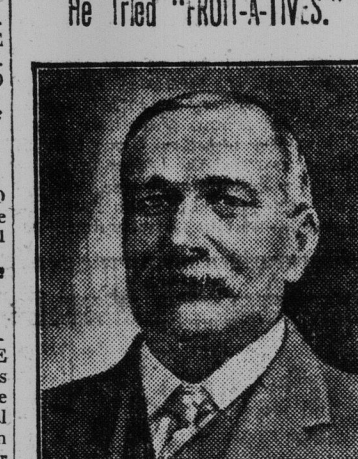

## MURDER OF WOMAN AND BABE DIES A SUICIDE

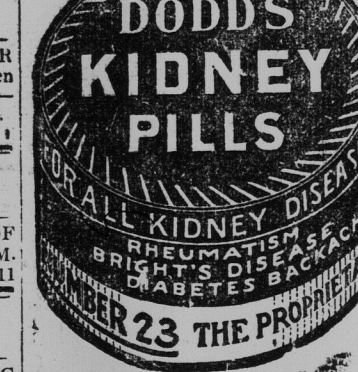
