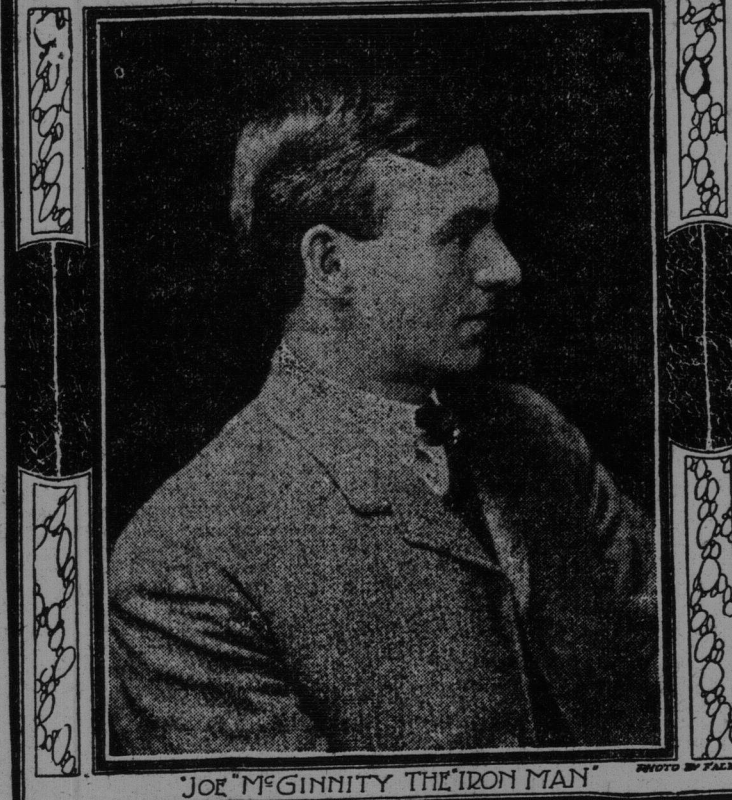

MORNING LOCALS

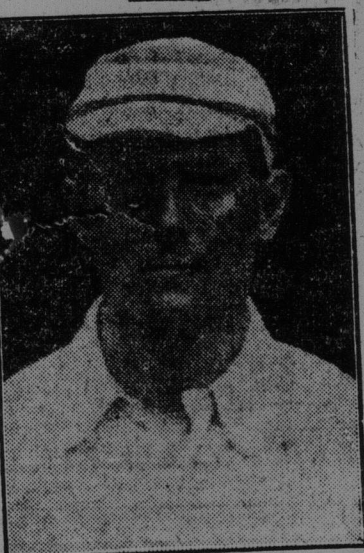

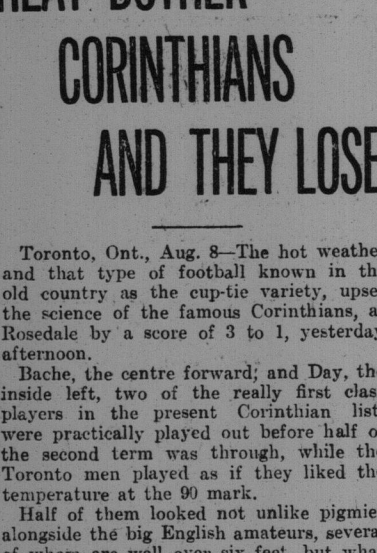
M. Morgan-Owen, Welsh international, who captained the Corinthians.

PLAN WORLD SOCIETY AS WAR PREVENTIVE

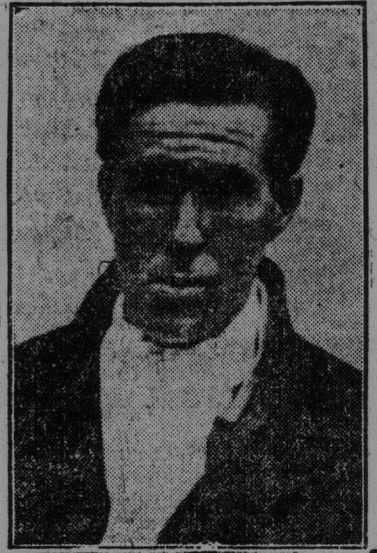
Boisac, Switzerland, Aug. 7.—The subcommittee on International economic and financial relations reported today to the division of economic and history of the Carnegie endowment of International peace, which is in session here, in favor of international endeavors to develop a great economic world society as a preventive of war. Each country, the report said, should become a part of the world unit through financial and commercial relations. Practical means to this end would require study of the needs for the investment of capital development of communications and increases of population, which should be carried on by international associations through public and private initiative.

Young Woman Makes Affidavit That Austrian Soldier to Whom She Was Engaged is Spy in U. S. Army. Washington, Aug. 7.—For the first time in many years the War department is perturbed over a charge that there is a spy enlisted in the United States army. Captain James Watson, recruiting officer at Indianapolis, has forwarded to the department affidavits charging Private George Petr, of the Coast Artillery at Fort Totten, N. Y., with being an Austrian secret agent. One of the affidavits is by Miss Clara A. Dyer, who had previously required about obtaining Petr's release from the army. She says that the man's real name is Count Windisch Gratz, that his home is in Prague, Bohemia, and that his object is to learn the composition of the remarkable high explosive "Dynamite" used in shells. Miss Dyer became engaged to the young Austrian, she says, and he confided to her his mission.
