



The attention of the public is directed to the following section of Cap. 36 of the Consolidated Statutes, dealing with "Nuisances and Municipal Regulations":

"Any person who shall throw fice in Newfoundland to the United any stones or ballast, or anything harbor or roadstead in this Colony or its dependencies shall, for every - 5 cts offence, be liable to a penalty not ground that his client was insane, and Over \$20 but not exceeding \$30 - 15 cts exceeding fifty dollars, cr to im-Over \$30 but not exceeding \$40 - 20 cts prisonment for a period not exceeding fifty days."
