year old daughter a terrible blow on
the head killing her instantly.
Beaulieu's wife and two men were
present at the time and divined the
crazed father's intention, but before
they could disarm him the bleedings
hody of his child was stretched at
tileir feet.
Beaulieu, who is a comparatively
young man had been showing symptoms of insanity for some time and
had been kept under a close watch, al
though he had not given indications of
a homieldal tendency previously.
The unbalancing of the man's mind
is attributed to excessive worry over
