

MESSINA, Jan. 4.—Frank Perret, of Brooklyn, assistant to Professor Matteucic, director of the Royal Observa% tory on Mount Vesuvius, speaking of the disaster here and in Calabria, says that other shocks are inevitable as there is a flaw in the earth's crust where the slip occurred.
