Chiefly Interested in Sequring Statement of Case—Situation in Mexico City.

Washington, July 17.—Just what foreign powers had inquired for a definition of the United States government's attitude in the present Mexican situation was still unknown official circles mentioned Great Britain and France, and the denial from Berlin that Germany had made representations, was generally accepted as removing that country from the list with the report that the situation had been discussed by representatives of the powers in Paris yesterday seemed to strengthen the belief that France was interested.

It was pointed out that both the British and French have heavy interests in Mexico.
