







One of the many mess resorted to in a great war is seen in the above illustration. These Italian iers belonging to the **Bersagileri** of the Italian army, have cunningly concealed their encampment from the sight if several Austrian aeroplanes which were sighted by these soldiers. The tents have been pitched beneath the ferke foliage in one of the great mountain valleys. To the right rises the mountain wall almost sheer, and clothed with rees, while in the background can be seen another wall shutting in the valley at the rear.
