DALHOUSIE WINNERS OF COLLEGE MEET

Acadia and St. Francis Xavier Failed to Appear—U. N. B. Sent Three Men and Good Ones.

Moncton, N. B., May 21.—The inter-collegiate sport meet was pulled off successfully this afternoon on the M. A. A. grounds, with a small number of spectators present to witness the various events. Lowering skies and a cool, damp breeze prevailed, rain being not far away throughout the afternoon. The majority of the ten events were, however, keenly contested between the representatives of Dalhousie and the University of New Brunswick, which were the only two institutions who sent teams to enter in the competition. For some unknown reason Acadia and St. Francis Xavier, both of whom were expected to send strong teams, did not appear, thus lessening the interest very materially. Dalhousie was represented by seven athletes, and the University of New Brunswick by three. Dalhousie carried off 51 points, and U. N. B. 39.
