Another Industry Probable for Woodstock.

Woodstock is to have another large
new industry in the near future, if the
proposal made by two prominent Toron-
to manufacturers is accepted by the
ratepayers of the city. These men
propose to form a company to be known
as the Karn Mfg. Co., Ltd., and will
rejuvenate the Karn name and patents
in the manufacture of pianos, play-
pianos and piano actions. They have
taken an option on the factory to buy
it for the sum of \$40,000. They agree
to employ 125 men for a term of ten
years and will commence operations
as soon as a bylaw is passed relative
to the city granting them a loan of
\$28,000.

It is predicted that this new indus-
trial growth will bring at least 500 new
families to Woodstock early in the
new year, and that the population,
which has stood still for nearly twenty
years, will be increased by several
thousand.

Hope Vaccination Order Will Last
a Long Time.

The merchants in Niagara Falls are
hoping that the vaccination order will
last for a long time. One retailer claims
that his receipts are more than 1,000
per cent over last Christmas. Traffic
on the bridges is almost at a standstill.
Only people employed on either side

gers and smugglers. No cases of small-
pox are reported here.
