48 Hours GREATER EFFORTS NEEDED TO WIN WAR

Great Superiority Over Enemy is Necessary in Order to Obtain Victory MORE MEN Are Needed on the West Front to Enforce Superiority

By Courier Leased Wire London, Jan. 13.—The military correspondent maintains that the prolongation of the "as the result of the foredoomed failure of the peace move," upon all the allies the duty of making greater efforts in order to achieve victory.
