> Directions for the election and ordination of Deacons, and the formation of Deacon's Courts in Congregations, with a circa to the right working of the Sustentation Fund Scheme.

> 1. A body of deacons, as many as may be deemed expedient by each congregation, shad be elected by all the members in full communion, at a meeting called for the purpose by ten free days nouce, and at which the minister of the congre

III. In case of new deacons being required ! supply the places of those removed by death, resignation, or otherwise, or to meet the necessities of a growing congregation, -their election and ordination shall take place in accordance with the foregoing directions.
