Among the additions during the recess is the first volume of a work prepared at Washington, containing the inaugural and annual messages of the Presidents of the United States, with biographical and historical notes. The work, when complete, will be found useful for reference.

The usual annual works of reference were either received during the last Session, or have since been added, special attention being given to commercial, financial and

statistical compilations.

The list of donations for the year contains a useful collection of the commercial laws of Japan and of the constitution and civil procedure of that country, in the English language, for which the Library is indebted to Mr. Nossé, His Japanese Majesty's Consul in British Columbia.

The catalogue of accessions is complete, and will be immediately distributed.
