After a long debate.

The said motion and Bill were by leave of the House withdrawn.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Bluke, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Wilmot, it

Ordered, That the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Standing Orders and Private Bills.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day the House was adjourned during pleasure and put into a Committee of the Whole, on the Bill intituled: "An Act to alter the limits of the "Counties of Joliette and Berthier, for electoral purposes."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Ritchie from the said Committee reported that they had gone through the said Lill, and had directed him to report the same to the House without any amendment.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Letellier de St. Just, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Lacoste, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was read a third time accordingly.
