Charge by the holder for such notice.

Foreign Bills may be protested.

Fees in such case.

V. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the holder or holders of any such Promissory Note, Draft, Order or Inland Bill of Exchange as aforesaid, to charge the sum of *seven pence half-penny* for each notice given to the drawer or indorser thereof.

VI. And be it enacted, That nothing contained in this Act shall 5 prevent the holder or holders of any Foreign Bill of Exchange from protesting or cause the same to be protested, but that the sum to be allowed to any Notary for noting and protesting the same shall be *two shillings and six-pence*, and the further sum of *seven-pence half-penny* for the notice to each of the indorsers 10 thereof, in addition to postages actually paid.

Holidays.

VII. And be it enacted, That the birth-day of the Sovereign, Christmas Day, New Year's Day and Good Friday shall be Holidays for the purposes of this Section, and any Promissory Note, Draft, Order or Bill of Exchange falling due on any one of the 15 said days, or on Sunday shall be deemed and taken to be due on the day following such Holiday or Sunday.

Extent of Act. VIII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall apply only to Upper Canada.
