STANDARDS OF QUALITY.

13. The following shall be the standards of Wheat and other Grain:—

Wheat.

- No. 1 White Winter-Shall be sound, plump, and free from admixture of other Grain.
- No. 2 White Winter—Shall be sound and good, but less free from other Grain than No. 1.
- 15 No. 1 Red Winter—Shall be sound, plump, and free from admixture of other Grain.
 - No. 2 Red Winter—Shall be sound and good, but less free from other Grain than No. 1.
- Extra Spring—Shall be sound, plump, and free from admixture of other Grain, and weigh not less than 61 lbs. per Imperial bushel.
 - No. 1 Spring—Shall be sound, free from admixture of other Grain, and weigh not less than 59 lbs. per Imperial bushel, and shall consist of two grades—No. 1 bright, and No. 1.
- No. 2 Spring—Shall be sound, but less free from other Grain than No. 1, and its weight shall not be less than 57 lbs. per Imperial bushel.
 - All unsound, damp, or very dirty Wheat of whatever kind, shall be classed "Bejected."

Peas.

- No. 1-Shall be clean and sound.
- 30 No. 2-Shall be sound, but too dirty for No. 1.
 - All unsound, damp, or very dirty Peas shall be classed "Rejected."

Corn.

Pure White—Pure Yellow—Mixed, or Rejected—Shall be classed according to its quality.

Oats.

No. 1.—Shall be clean and sound.
