## 1 killed in fog

Sunday morning's fog claimed the life of an 18-year-old Woodlands School student and seriously injured three other people in two accidents shortly after midnight.

George James Ganyu was killed instantly when his car, heading southbound on Erin Mills Parkway collided with a northbound car driven by Albert Lorne Post of Caledon.

Police say Ganyu realized too late that he had crossed the centre line in the fog and swerved to avoid the Post vehicle but was struck broadside just below Thomas Street.

Barbara Lee West, a 19-year-old passenger in the Ganyu vehicle is in Mississauga Hospital with major injuries.

In a collision on the North Service Road at Ravendale Court, police say a westbound car driven by Ronald MacNaughton, 21, of Norval, crossed over the centre line of the North Service Road and collided with a car driven by Craig Gemmel, 16, of Windy Oaks Drive in Mississauga. Gemmel was transferred to Toronto Western Hospital with major injuries and was in intensive care yesterday.

Gemmel's 19-year-old brother, Brian, a passenger in his vehicle, was taken to Mississauga Hospital with major injuries and removed from intensive care Monday.

MacNaughton is charged with impaired driving in connection with the second accident. No charges were laid in the first.

### **Realtor charged**
