Edmonton, Alta.	1 Nov/44	Wednesday	The "Props" parade normally held on Thursday (tomorrow) was held today in conjunction with the Commanding Officer's parade at which the whole station was present. The parade was held in the Drill Hall at 1400 hours and every effort was made to make it one of the finest parades inasmuch as it was the last parade on the Station of No. 4 I.T.S. The honour student was R.272469 LAC Lenke, R. with an average of 89%. This course was most unique in that everyone of the 27 airmen who commenced training successfully completed the course. 	2 Nov/44	Thursday	The whole station is in an uproar of work - all the trainees busy obtaining clearances and the staff trying to obtain the help of the trainees before they are posted leaving all the work to Headquarters. Postings have been received for practically all aircrew personnel who will be posted by this Saturday. With the disbandment of the Unit pending, a terrific amount of dismantling and moving of beds, equipment, etc., is necessary and next week without the aid of the aircrew lads, it will be a much slower job. Station Hospital Inventory closed out.	
	3 Nov/44	Friday	The first groups of aircrew are leaving today for their new Units and already the buildings of this school are beginning to resemble a morgue. The colder weather has made it necessary to do without the services of the band on the noon "Victory Loan Parade" in downtown Edmonton. The fine Indian Summer we enjoyed in October has been replaced by cold winds and temperatures hovering around the 10 above mark. The Armament Section was closed out today.	
	4 Nov/44	Saturday	The last of the aircrew left today and Headquarters have tightened their belts preparatory to closing off the Unit prior to posting on Nov. 10th. A lot of work is ahead but a good spirit prevails which lightens the work tremendously. The dance orchestra played at a dance at the N.W. Air Command tonight (R.C.A.F.) Insofar as equipment is concerned a routine day was observed.
