PROPOSED WORDING FOR CONFEDERATION BUILDINGS TABLET:

"The corner stone of this building was laid July first, 1927, as the first of a group of departmental buildings to be known as Confederation Block, in commemoration of the Diamond Jubilee of Confederation. This building was completed in the year 1930.

"His Excellency the Right Honourable the Viscount Willingdon, G.C.M.G., G.C.S.I., Governor General of Canada; the Right Honourable William Lyon Mackenzie King, G.M.C., LL.D., D. C. L., Prime Minister of Canada; the Honourable John Campbell Elliott, K.C., D.C.L., Minister of Public Works; James Blake Hunter, B.A.; Deputy Minister of Public Works; Thomas William Fuller, Chief Architect."
