Honoured and Dear Sir :

As one opposed to the Church Union Bill, I wish to say that I would be perfectly satisfied with the amendments proposed by the Private Bills Committee, to render the same inoperative until the Courts give their decision on the Constitutional questions that have been raised.

The Bill, as introduced, is very objectionable to a large section of the Presbyterian Church, and if the matter could now be referred to the people, I believe their verdict would be "let us remain Presbyterians". When we are as united on the question as the Methodists are, it will be time enough to talk of Union. This is not Union, but division.
