

The other points has been sent to the respective Missionaries.

It has been usual to expend these amounts in the relief of distress among the aged and helpless Indians. It would, however, be preferable to use these sums in such a manner that the money would be productive of greater advantages to the Indians generally; such as in the purchase of Farming Implements, Seed, Fencing, Gear and Boats; thus encouraging and assisting the Indians in settling down
