
I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 17th Instant, submitting the case of Jacques Murray, touching his right to the use of wood without permission from the Seminary, and in reply, I have to refer you to the letter addressed to you on the 24th November 1902, the latter part of which directs you to let the Indians understand that the question of right to cut wood on the lands of the Seminary is one between themselves and the Seminary, and not being under the control of the Department.
