with reference to your communication of the 4th Hovember, I beg to say that the Department has caused very careful inquiry to be made with resmest to the parentage Charles and Mapoleon Provost. It is learned that these you men are the sons of a Frenchman and "Crowface" an Indian woman of the Peigan Reserve. There were five children im the family and none of them were born on the reserve, ale though their parents lived adjacent to it. The Department notes your recommendation that these young men be received into membership with the Peigan Band. It is not, however thought advisable to take such action. The Government has already defraved the expenses of their education and in : doing, it is considered that they have been fairly dealt and it would seem to be a mistake to accept them last mip.with the Band.

The Indian Agent has been told that the Joung should be made to leave the reserve, but that the Depart might in the future be prepared to grant them some assis For your further information I give the following serve from a letter addressed to Mr. Yeomans in this matter:
