(i) The Canadian Forces Liaison Committee have been furnishing Personnel, a number of skilled Canadians are already serving here and 2,500 unskilled men are also receiving training in Canadian universities. These facilities are, it is believed, being made available for the training in the autumn of a further number of recruits in this field.

(vii) A small number of Medical Officers for the fighting services up to nearly 100 have been obtained from Canada, and consideration has been given in consultation with the United

Kingdom High Commissioner in Canada to the possibility of approaching the Canadian Government for permission for Canadian nurses to volunteer for military and other services here.

(viii) Proposals have been under discussion with the Canadian Government for some time regarding the supply of Trained Firemen to assist the fire-fighting services here. It seems likely that the Canadian Government will authorise the formation of a unit of 400 to 500 men for despatch to this country.

(vi) A Canadian Garrison Company is being formed in Gibralter by the Canadian Government to meet the requirements of some 3,000 men. This Garrison Company will be under command of the Canadian Forces.

(v) The Canadian Government have recently been asked for a detailed description of Canadian Civilian Relief, proposals were made to consider the formation of a unit of 10,000 men. If it is understood that this relief force may be required, proposals will be made to consider the formation of a unit of

(iv) Following an appeal for assistance by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, the Canadian Government have agreed to contribute £100,000 towards the relief of the people of Hong Kong.
