- Q Who spoke?
- R.S.M. Lloyd.
- Q And what did he say?
- A I believe his words were 'I am instructing you, Frivate Advent, to report for duty', or words to that effect.
- Q Do you think that the occupent of the room, if any, could hear the order?
- A I would say Yes. Sir.
- Q Well, was the order spoken in a tone of voice that could be heard?
- A Yes. Sir.
- Q Did you hear any reply?
- A No. Sir.
- Q What did you do then?
- A I went to the outside of the Building, to the window of the Steward's room.
- When you say the Stewart, are you referring to the accused.
- A I am calling it the Steward's room -- I don't know whether it is called the Steward's room or not. It is the room where R.S.M. Lloyd was outside the door.
- Well now, who occupied that room? Do you know who occupied that room?
- A Well, normally I would say the Steward of the Less, Sir.
- Q How long did it take you to go from your position at the door to the window?
- A Oh, I would say about a minute.
- Q Did you look in the window?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Did you see anyone in the room?
- A Yes, Sir; Private Advent.
- That is the accused, is it?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q What was the accused doing in the room?
- A When I looked in the window he was coming towards the window, Sir.
- Q Did you see anyone else in the room?
- A No. Sir.
- Q Was the window open or closed?
- A The window was open a little, Sir.
- Q Now many windows were there?
- A Just the one that I was at, that I know of.
