
Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter, date and file number above noted, regarding the proposed amalgamation of the Comox Band of this Agency and the Salmon River Band of the Alert Bay Agency, as outlined in my letter of September 20th last, I wish to advise that I called a meeting of the Comox Band for Wednesday last, December 11th, at Comox Indian Reserve, to discuss the various points mentioned in your letter.

After full discussion of all matters pertaining to the amalgamation, it was unanimously decided by the members present that they wished the amalgamation to proceed without delay.

There are a total of eleven souls belonging to the Salmon River Band and already they have completed the building of two good, substantial houses on the Comox Reserve and unofficially have already taken up residence on that Reserve. I would, therefore, recommend that this amalgamation be approved.
