Newburgh Mechanics' Institute was organized in 1887, beginning operations with the library of the Newburgh Literary and Debating Club, whose building was the Institute's. Its library contains nearly one thousand volumes.

In the Reading Room are to be found The Toronto Daily Mail and Daily Globe, and the following six weeklies: Grip, Life (New York), Puck, London Illustrated News, Harper's Weekly, Littell's Living Age, all but the last mentioned being illustrated; also these five illustrated monthly magazines: Century, Scribner's, Harper's, Review of Reviews, Cosmopolitan.
