

*A Very Amusing Story.*

*The "Western Morning News".*—This story brings to mind the days of Arcady; it is obviously written from first-hand knowledge, and many of the scenes and episodes described, must have really happened. Camp life in British Columbia, must be one of life's little ideals that many dream of, but few realize. In England, a few volunteers or an occasional party of young fellows are all that ever try life, under canvas, but in Canada, whole families seem to migrate to the seashore, and establish a regular canvas town.
