HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

ANY even numbered section ef Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, excepting 8 and 28, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any Derson who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 166 acres, mere

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion lands Agency er Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:—

(i) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership is land will not meet this requirement.

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is de-fined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclu-sive of the width of road allow-ances crossed in the measure-

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commis-sioner of Dominion Lands at Ot-tawa, of intention to apply fer tawa,
