SYNOPOPIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alber and in Mainton, Sassatchewan of Alber a. Applicant must appear in person at he Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain sonditions.

Outles—Six months residence upon and conditions.

Dutles—Six months residence upon and condition of the land in eacn of three years. A homesteader may live within land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberuine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residenc is prformed in the vrcmity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing many pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$8.00 per acre. section alongside his homestead. The \$3.00 per acre.
Duties—Six months residence in each of three years, after earning homestead patti; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Preemption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his home-stead right may take a purchased home-stead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to re-luction is case of rough, scrubby or stony and. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
