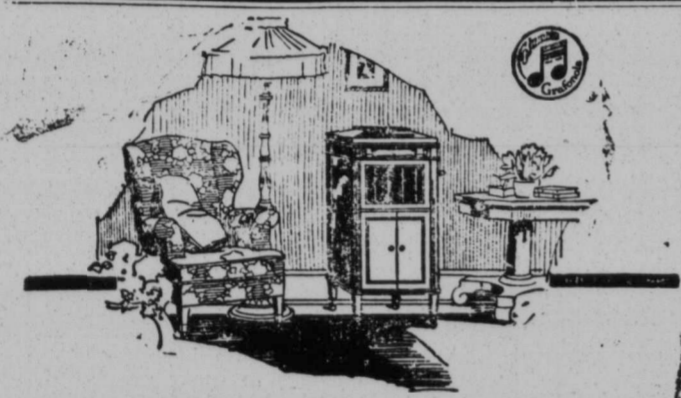

Around The Town

A meeting of the North Shore District Press Association was held in Chatham on Friday last, when matters relating to the Press were discussed at length. Those present were: L. B. Anstey, Graphic, Campbellton; C. M. Mersereau, Northern Light, Bathurst; R. A. N. Jarvis, Advocate, Newcastle; J. L. Stewart, World; J. F. Benson and A. T. Ross, Commercial, Chatham.

A good sized country market collected at Fredericton on Saturday. Meat was plentiful and sold at varying prices. Veal resumed its old price 15 to 20 cents per pound. Pork was from 22 to 24 cents per pound. Eggs sold at from 60 to 65 cents per dozen in the market and were sold around the city for 50 cents per dozen. Potatoes brought \$3 a barrel while turnips sold for 90 cents a barrel. Butter held the old price of 55 cents. Both green and dry wood were sold at varying prices from \$11 to \$13 a cord. Good island hay brought \$16 to \$18 a ton.
